PHYSICAL EXAM REQUIREMENTS

- Before beginning any Health Technology program, (ADN, VN, CNA, RT, or DMS), a current physical exam is required on the attached form. Must be done no more than one year prior to starting the program.
- You may choose your own physician's office or clinic to perform the physical examination; a list of clinics in the Santa Barbara area is provided for your convenience. Call ahead to confirm fees.
- One side of the physical exam form must be filled out by you, and one side by the physician.
- Take with you to your appointment any proof of immunizations, medical records, etc. The required immunizations are listed below.
- Be sure that the physician signs all required areas before you leave his/her office.
- If you want a copy of the physical exam for your records, <u>please make your own copy</u> before submitting the completed original form to the Health Technologies Office.

IMMUNIZATION POLICIES

The SBCC Health Technology Programs <u>require</u> certain immunizations for their students. The State of California Health and Welfare Agency, Department of Health Services <u>recommends</u> additional immunizations for students. Below is a list of the immunizations required by the SBCC Health Technology Programs and recommended by the Department of Health Services.

REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS:

TB Skin Test – Must show proof of a negative skin test for Tuberculosis within 12 months of starting the program and every 12 months while in the program.

Chest x-ray – Only if TB skin test is positive. Chest x-ray required every three years. Note from physician stating that patient is free from symptoms of active TB required annually.

Rubeola* – Documentation of receipt of two doses of a measles-containing vaccine <u>or</u> Rubeola titre test.

Rubella* – Documentation of receipt of rubellacontaining vaccine <u>or</u> Rubella titre test.

*The MMR vaccine immunizes for Measles, Mumps, and Rubella.

RECOMMENDED IMMUNIZATIONS:

Mumps* – Receipt of one dose of mumps vaccine.

Hepatitis B – Documentation of either receipt of three doses of hepatitis B vaccine <u>or</u> of documented seropositivity. Federal OSHA may require employers to give employees of health care facilities the hepatitis B vaccine. If you work in the health care field, ask your employer. If you do not get the series, you will be required to sign a declination form.

Polio – Documented receipt of three doses of polio vaccine or seropositivity to all three polio types.

Tetanus-Diphtheria – A 3-dose primary series with a booster dose every ten years.
